





PROXY SET-UP TO USE OUR E-RESOURCES FROM HOME

GOOGLE CHROME BROWSER (v. 138.0.7204.158)

Open the Chrome menu and click 'Settings'.



Click 'System' then click 'Open your computer's proxy settings...'.





Manual proxy setup

Use a proxy server for Ethernet or Wi-Fi connections. These settings don't apply to VPN connections.

Use the proxy server except for addresses that start with the following entries. Use semicolons (;) to separate entries.

Don't use the proxy server for local (intranet) addresses

Save

This will open the 'Proxy' settings in the 'Network and Internet' settings of your operating system. Scroll down to the 'Manual proxy setup' section and then turn on 'Use a proxy server'.

The 'Address' is: **proxy.bibl.u-szeged.hu** and the 'Port' number is: **3128**

Click on the 'Save' button and open the library's website:

www.ek.szte.hu

An authentication window should pop up asking for your username and password.

The username is the number of your student/library card.





The password is auto generated from your date of birth in a given form: day (two characters), month (month's name in English, first three characters, capital letters) and the last two figures of the year.

DD-MMM-YY

Example:
September 25th, 1994

25-SEP-94

Your password in our online catalogue is the same, so changing it will affect this one as well. The database of our registered users is refreshed in every 24 hours, therefore this service will not immediately be available for you after registration or in case you have to change your library card.

Your browser is now ready to use the library's e-resources. Later, if you want to disable the proxy, open the Proxy Settings section of the operating system's Settings again and turn off 'Use a Proxy Server'. Ask us if you need help or more information: [e-help](#).

Important!

From the currently available browsers only the Mozilla Firefox has its own options for controlling the proxy settings, all the other browsers (Chrome, Opera, Edge, etc.) will modify the general Internet settings of your computer, so all the other installed browsers will be affected.

We recommend to set up the proxy in Firefox to get access to the library's e-resources and use a different browser along with it to be able to use other public websites.

With only one installed browser your only option is to turn the proxy settings off and on, depending on what type of site you want to use.
